





PULASKI COUNTY FREIGHT FLOW



Georgia Ocean Freight Highlights:

- The Port of Savannah has been the Nation's fastest-growing container port over the past eight years, and is the 4th largest in the USA and 2nd busiest on the East Coast.
- The Port of Brunswick is the 5th largest auto port in the Nation, 3rd for auto imports, and is the 2nd largest grain facility on the East Coast.
- The Port of Savannah was the 2nd busiest U.S. container port for the export of American goods by tonnage in FY2011 (behind only the Port of L.A.)
- Port of Savannah handled 8.7% of all U.S. containerized cargo volume and 12.5% of all U.S. containerized exports in FY2011.
- The Port today handles the most containerized poultry in the Nation and the most refrigerated containerized exports on the East Coast.



State Infrastructure Overview:

- Georgia has over **5,000 miles** of railroad track
- Home to the **largest intermodal facility** on the east coast
- Georgia maintains **1,200 miles of interstate** highways and **20,000 miles** of federal and state highways.
- Georgia has **144 public and private airports**; 10 of these provide notable **air cargo** operations
- The **World's busiest passenger airport** is in Atlanta
- Atlanta's airport is the **10th largest** in the U.S. for cargo, and **#30 in the World**.
- **Atlanta, Savannah, and Albany** are home to the top three air cargo ports in Georgia (*in order*), with **ATL handling 98%** of the state's annual air freight volumes.
- Over **40% of North American manufacturing** locations are within a 500 mile radius of Atlanta

GEORGIA'S RAILROAD NETWORK





- Georgia is **home to 24 freight railroads** (2 class-1's, and 23 short-line railroads)
- Georgia's railroad industry **employed 6,753 Georgians** in 2011.
- Georgia **has the largest railroad network in the Southeast**, and ranked:
 - **7th highest** in the Nation for total rail miles (4,680 miles of track)
 - **5th most** rail tons terminating in State
 - **13th** for number of railroads in U.S.
- Cargo is **within two or fewer days by truck** from 80% of the U.S. industrial and commercial markets.
- Metro Atlanta is **ranked 6th in ground freight movement** in the Nation
- **2 of the 5 largest private warehouse** operators in North America are headquartered in GA (#1 & #5)
- **2 of the 10 largest 3PL's** in North America are headquartered in GA (#2 & #7)
- Nationwide, **each freight rail job supports 4.5 jobs** elsewhere in the economy.
- Each **\$1 billion** in new rail investment **creates more than 17,000 jobs**.

The logistics industry is a dynamic “ecosystem” whose core is made up of companies that provide logistics services (*i.e. trucking, rail, software*) and those that consume them (*i.e. manufacturers, wholesalers, distribution centers*)

Pulaski County is home to:

3 logistics providers who employ a total of 8 in the County and generate \$1,208,000 in annual sales.

22 logistics-enabled companies who employ an additional 282 Georgians and generate \$238,962,000 in annual sales.


- Georgia is home to **11,000 providers** of logistics services
- Providers of logistics services **employ over 142,000** and together generated more than **\$16 Billion** in sales in 2010.
- Georgia **ranks 5th in the Nation** for logistics and supply chain employment
- More than **24 logistics related associations** have chapters in Georgia
- **15 Fortune 500 companies** are headquartered in Georgia
- Of the top 25 global 3PLs, **90% have operations** in Georgia.
- Georgia is home to **6 of the top 50 cargo carriers**, including the world’s **number one** carrier UPS.
- **Ranked 9th Nationally** with nearly **450,000** commercially licensed Georgia truck drivers
- **70% of the top 20** supply chain management software providers have operations in Georgia. **25% are headquartered here** including: Manhattan Associates, Red Prairie, Infor, Logility, Aldata Solutions, and CDC Software.
- Georgia **ranks 5th in the U.S.** for Supply Chain Technology employment
