

## Minutes of Regular Meeting

The regular meeting of the Commissioner of Pulaski County was held at 10:00 a.m., April 4, 2016 for the purpose of attending to the affairs of Pulaski County as related to the Commissioner's office.

Commissioner Hall led attendees in the pledge of allegiance.

Immediately following the pledge of allegiance, Commissioner Hall asked City Manager Tim Young to give the invocation.

The first item of business was to hear from Archway. Lee Slade spoke and stated that the Teen Maze will be April 21, 2016 all day. He also stated that the Pulaski Tomorrow Golf and Gala will be April 16, 2016 at Southern Hills.

The second item of business was to hear a report from the Sheriff's Office. Sheriff Billy Cape stated that there were 32 currently in jail, 42 civil papers served, and 63 citations written. He also mentioned that the Sheriff Department was working on a missing person case.

The third item of business was to hear a report from Public Safety. Leslie Sewell stated that March was a quiet month for fires. He also mentioned wanting to help the deputies with the missing person search, but it was at a standstill at the time.

The fourth item of business was to hear a report from United Pulaski. Lee Slade stated that he currently has three active projects. He mentioned that United Pulaski elected Hollingsworth & Vose as Small Business of the Year and on April 21, 2016 a group will be going to Atlanta along with Central Georgia Tech to see if H&V did win the award.


The fifth item of business was for Commissioner Hall to adopt a resolution for a 1% SPLOST sales tax to be put on the July 26, 2016 ballot.


The sixth item of business was for Commissioner Hall to sign an Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of Hawkinsville to divide SPLOST money in half between the county and city.

The seventh item of business was to hear floor comments. Donna Rickerson spoke for the Chamber of Commerce and gave a brief summary of the events that have taken place. She stated that the Steak House had been chosen for Business of the Month. She mentioned that Peaches to Beaches was a success, as well as the Harness Festival. She stated that all of the advertised events for the Harness Festival were able to take place, despite the weather, and that there were 187 people in attendance for the sponsor dinner for the Harness Festival. She mentioned that on April 12 at 7:00 p.m. there will be a free forum held at the Opera House for the community to hear a question-and-answer session from the candidates for Sheriff and Tax Commissioner. She also mentioned the Business after Hours meeting from March where Daphne Lewis came to speak about her bamboo farm and chalo sulky business.
