

Minutes of Regular Meeting

The regular meeting of the Commissioner of Pulaski County was held at 10:00 a.m., July 11, 2016 for the purpose of attending to the affairs of Pulaski County as related to the Commissioner's office.

Commissioner Hall led attendees in the pledge of allegiance.

Immediately following the pledge of allegiance, Commissioner Hall asked City Manager, Tim Young, to give the invocation.

The first item of business was to hear from Archway. Michelle Elliot stated that July has been a fun and busy month. She mentioned that the garden club visited the botanical gardens at the University of Georgia. She also mentioned that they will be taking 60 boys to the University of Georgia to participate in the championship basketball game for the Life League. She also mentioned working on historic preservation plans with the City of Hawkinsville.

The second item of business was to hear a report from the Sheriff's Office. Sheriff Billy Cape stated that there were 32 currently in jail, 56 civil papers served, and 123 citations written. He also stated that in some of the traffic cases, some drugs had been recovered and that there had been numerous drug cases in June and the first of July.

The third item of business was to hear a report from United Pulaski. Lee Slade mentioned an active project going on in which money is being raised to move forward. He also mentioned an opportunity for the park to be GRAD certified and a grant that's being worked on to cover the costs for this certification.

The fourth item of business was to hear a report from the Chamber of Commerce. Donna Rickerson stated that SunMark Bank is the Business of the Month. She also mentioned a few important events coming up, including the Back to School Bash on July 28th, the duck race on August 27th, and the Harvest Fest on October 22nd.

The fifth item of business was to hear a report from Public Safety. Leslie Sewell stated that the month of June was pretty quiet and mentioned a few fires, drills, and rescues that took place. Commissioner Hall accepted a recommendation from the Planning and Zoning Board to rezone a piece of property from general agriculture to public institution for the purpose of building a new fire substation. Commissioner Hall asked Leslie to speak on behalf of the new fire station. Leslie stated that everyone is ready for it to be built and that a fire truck is already available to be stationed there once the station is completed.

The sixth item of business was for Commissioner Hall to make an appointment to the Pulaski County Board of Family and Children Services. Rose Rhodes was re-appointed to a five year term that will end June 30, 2021.

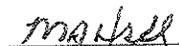

The eighth item of business was for Commissioner Hall to amend the 2015 budget. He spoke about which accounts would be affected and how they would be affected.

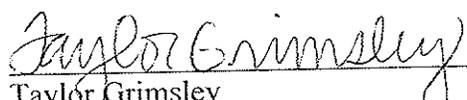
The ninth item of business was to hear floor comments. No one spoke at this time.
